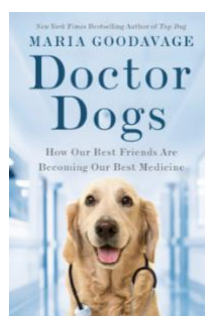

Leading Experts in the training of Diabetes Alert Dogs, Seizure Dogs and Psychiatric Service Dogs

Medical Mutts' proprietary training methods have been scientifically demonstrated. Each dog is carefully selected in rescues and shelters and tested throughout the different stages of training. After placement, the trainers provide regular monitoring, until the dog and their new person have become an effective working team.

Different programs for different needs

Owners of qualifying dogs can have them trained to help with their disability through Board & Train, Group Classes or Private Coaching programs. Dogs can learn to help with Diabetes, Seizures, Psychiatric conditions, Autism, mobility issues, POTS, etc. After completion, the human and dog team will be given the Canine Good Citizen Test and the Public Access Test.

Over 80 dogs rescued per year

To be considered, the dogs must be between 1-2 years old. They must be friendly, in good health and have the physical and temperament qualities to become service dogs. Most rescue dogs cannot be trained as service dogs. Only 1 out of every 4 dogs will become a service dog. The ones that don't meet the industry standards are placed in good homes as pets.

Contributing in research in the field of medical detection

Medical Mutts collaborates in research projects with different institutions involved in the field of canine medical detection, in the US and abroad.

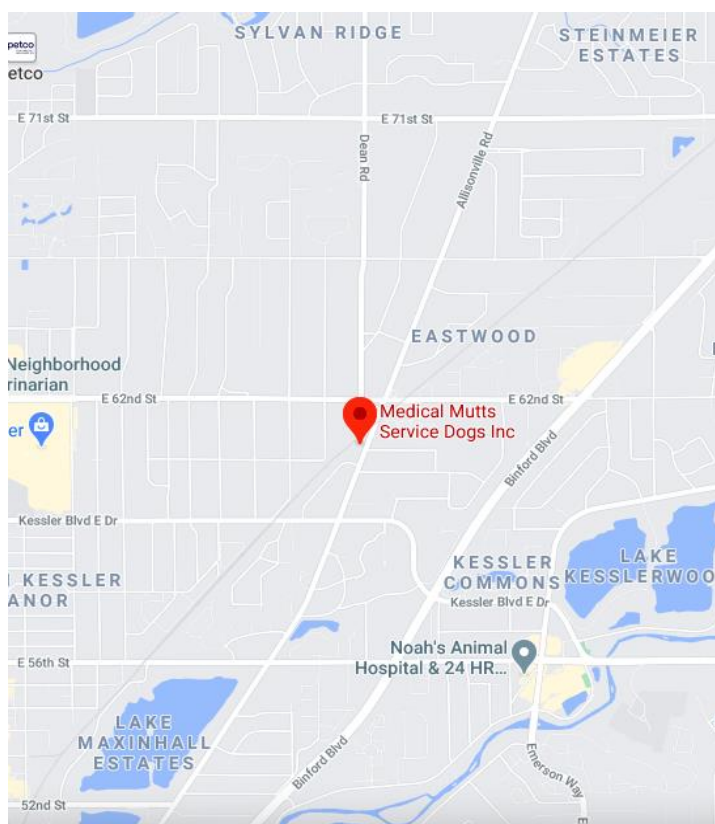
